#### Mission:

To ensure that people with intellectual and developmental disabilities have equal opportunities and receive the services and supports they need to live and work in South Dakota communities.



# Home and Community Based Services (HCBS)

- DDD operates two waivers which provide services to South Dakotans with intellectual or developmental disabilities (I/DD)
  - HCBS services are provided in lieu of Intermediate Care Facility for Individuals with Intellectual Disabilities (ICF/IID) services
- The term "Waiver" designates CMS approval for the state to deliver HCBS to a subset of the state's Medicaid population



## ID/DD Eligibility

- Disability eligibility requirements outlined in Administrative Rules of South Dakota (ARSD) 67:54:04:05
  - An individual is considered developmentally disabled if the individual meets all of the following criteria:
    - 1) The individual has a severe, chronic disability attributable to intellectual disability, cerebral palsy, epilepsy, head injury, brain disease, or autism or any other condition, other than mental illness, closely related to intellectual disability and requires treatment or services similar to those required for individuals with intellectual disabilities. To be closely related to intellectual disability, a condition must cause impairment of general intellectual functioning or adaptive behavior similar to that of intellectual disability;
    - 2) The disability manifested itself before the individual reached age 22; and
    - 3) The disability is likely to continue indefinitely.
- Utilize the diagnostic requirements outlined in the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Medical Disorders (DSM)- 5
- Must be receiving SSI or be aged, blind, or disabled and have income less than 300 percent of the SSI standard benefit amount



### CHOICES

- Community, Hope, Opportunity, Independence, Careers, Empowerment, Success (CHOICES)
- The CHOICES waiver is a comprehensive waiver program
  - Goal is to assist individuals in leading healthy, independent and productive lives to the fullest extent possible; promote the full exercise of their rights as citizens of the state of South Dakota; and promote the integrity of their families.


- CHOICES waiver

## Family Support 360

- Family Support 360 provides participants with an individualized budget used to self-direct services and supports
  - Assists with identifying natural and paid supports to keep their family together and supported in their home and community.
  - Each individual receiving FS 360 services chooses a Family Support Coordinator who assists the individual and their family make an individualized
    service plan

#### Family Support 360 Waiver Services

- Support Coordination
- Respite care
- Companion care
- Personal care
- Supported Employment
- Environmental accessibility
- Vehicle modification
- Specialized Medical Adaptive Equipment and Supplies
- Nutritional supplements
- Family Support does not provide funding for residential services
- Family Support does not provide funding for room and board

## **Other DDD Programs**

- Community Training Services (CTS)
  - Career exploration, community living training and follow-along services for people needing less intensive services or who do not meet the eligibility criteria for HCBS
- Strengthening Families Program
  - Services for families needing less intensive services or who do not meet the eligibility criteria for HCBS
- Respite Care Program
  - Temporary relief for families caring for children or adults in their home
- Private Intermediate Care Facility for Individuals with Intellectual Disabilities (ICF/IID)
  - Intensive services delivered in an "institution" (4 beds or more) for children under age 22 in need of "active treatment"
