Successful candidates for admission will usually meet the following minimum criteria: a 2.7 GPA and ACT composite score of 20.

Application Process

1. Submit a completed application form.
 - Fill out the application form online and then print it.
 - If you require more space than allotted for the narrative questions, you can create a separate document to type and print your answers.
2. Submit a \$30.00 nonrefundable processing fee along with the application form.
3. Submit official high school and college transcripts.
4. Submit American College Testing Program (ACT) scores.
5. Submit three Avera McKennan School of Radiologic Technology recommendation forms. There are two options for submitting the reference forms:
 - Submit the forms in a sealed envelope with the reference's signature across the flap. Or,
 - Each person providing a reference can submit the form via email directly to the mckennanradtechschool@avera.org email address.
6. It is highly suggested that the recommendation forms be filled out by a former/current employer, faculty member, advisor, or an individual who can speak of your academic ability, work ethic, and character.

Interview Process

Upon receiving all the above materials, the Program Director will determine if academic admission requirements have been met. A personal interview will be arranged with those applicants meeting the admission requirements in the months of January and February. If you do not meet the requirements, you will receive a written explanation. The Admissions Committee will review the data submitted by each applicant who qualified for an interview, and the top candidates will be selected for acceptance into the program.

Avera Sacred Heart School of Radiologic Technology

Tuition and Fees

- Fees: \$500 annually

- Uniforms: Students are required to wear surgical scrub type uniforms (in hunter green). The costs vary considerably, depending on individual preference. Uniforms are the responsibility of the student.

Application Process

Those seeking admission can obtain application materials beginning October 1 by calling 605-668-8158. No provisions are available to apply online. See website for list of required materials.

Application Deadline

The program director reviews all complete applications. Personal interviews are granted and arranged with eligible applicants.

Interview Process

Interviews will be held with the Admissions Committee for those eligible and with completed application materials. The composite score from application materials and personal interview will be combined to determine student selection. The final decision for admission into the School of Radiologic Technology will be at the discretion of the Admissions Committee. Upon acceptance into the program, a deposit of \$250 is required to hold the position for the next program start date. The program starts in August of each year.

In the event of a student's withdrawal prior to the start of the program, an applicant may be selected from an alternate list, pending the discretion of the Admissions Committee.

Admission Policy

Admittance to BHSU is based on the academic and personal qualifications of the applicant in accordance with SD Board of Regents regulations. Students must have completed the following core with at least a 2.0 GPA:

- 4 years of English
- 3 years of Social Studies
- 3 years of Math (algebra or advanced)
- 3 years of Lab Science
- 1 year of Fine Arts

In addition, students must also meet one of the following requirements: minimum cumulative GPA of 2.6, minimum composite ACT score of 18, or class rank in the top 60% of graduating class.

Admission Procedures

Applicants should submit an application for admission, \$20 application fee, ACT scores and a high school transcript. Upon acceptance, a Residence Life and medical immunization form will be sent out to be completed prior to class registration.

Admission Policy

In order to be considered for admission to Mitchell Technical College, an applicant must complete the following requirements:

1. Submit an Application for Admission. The application form is available at most high school offices, at the MTC campus and online on the MTC website. It is free to apply.
2. Send an *official* copy of your academic records (high school transcript, college transcript or high school equivalency certificate). Your high school, the registrar of the last college you attended, or the testing center where you took the General Education Development test can provide copies of your academic records.
3. In order to be accepted into a full-time program of study, you must meet the required entrance examination scores or submit entrance examination test scores ie. ACT, SAT, ACCUPLACER, etc. MTC accepts the Smarter Balanced test with scores of 3 or higher in English/Language Arts (ELA) and Math. All applicants must submit entrance examination scores or schedule an appointment to complete the entrance exam. Test scores from a 5-year period will be accepted.
4. Pay a \$60 non-refundable matriculation fee.
5. After acceptance to a program:
 - A start date will be identified.
 - Students will register for courses.
6. Once a program is full, a tuition deposit of \$150 will be required of all students accepted to that program. This is a tuition deposit and will be applied to the student's tuition the first semester of classes. In the event a student opts not to attend, **the tuition deposit is non-refundable.**

SOUTH DAKOTA OPPORTUNITY SCHOLARSHIP

The South Dakota Opportunity Scholarship provides up to \$6,500 over four years to a qualifying student who attends an eligible higher education institution in South Dakota. Recipients may participate in the South Dakota Opportunity Scholarship program for the equivalent of four academic years (eight consecutive fall and spring terms), or until attaining a baccalaureate degree. During each academic year, one-half of the annual scholarship award will be distributed at the beginning of the fall semester and the other half distributed at the beginning of the spring semester:

- \$ 1,300 - 1st year of attendance
- \$ 1,300 - 2nd year of attendance
- \$ 1,300 - 3rd year of attendance
- \$ 2,600 - 4th year of attendance

Initial Eligibility Requirements

1. Be a resident of South Dakota at time of high school graduation.
2. Have an ACT composite score of 24 or higher before the beginning of post-secondary education. If using a SAT score, the sum of the verbal and mathematics scores on the SAT must be at least 1090.
3. Complete high school course requirements with no final grade below a "C" (2.0 on a 4.0 scale) and a cumulative high school GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale (grade of "B") prior to graduation (Note: One unit of high school credit equals 1 year of instruction).
4. Effective for those students entering into postsecondary education for the first time on or after August 2013, the curriculum requirements specified in section 3 above are not required for any student who has received a composite score on the ACT of at least 28 and meets the ACT college readiness benchmarks scores equaling or exceeding 18 for English, 22 for Reading, 22 for Math, and 23 for Science.
5. Attend a university, college, or technical school accredited by the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools and that provides instruction from a campus located in South Dakota.
6. Enter into the program within 5 years of high school graduation, or within 1 year of the student's release from active duty military service (if that release is within 5 years of the date of the student's high school graduation). Students seeking to transfer from a regionally accredited university, college, or technical school located outside of South Dakota may do so within two years following high school graduation and be eligible to receive partial award.

Financial Aid

In general, the process for applying for financial assistance involves these steps.

1. **APPLY FOR ADMISSION AS WELL AS FINANCIAL AID** - Institutions require both an application for admission and for financial aid. Application deadlines are very important and vary with each institution. Find these out and meet the deadline.
2. **SUBMIT A NEED ANALYSIS FORM** - In addition to the financial aid application mentioned above, most institutions require completion of a need analysis form. A need analysis form helps institutions distribute limited funds by reporting how much you and your family can afford to pay for education. To receive aid you must be accepted in a program and complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). There are a number of processors for the FAFSA. Check with the institution that you are interested in to determine the proper forms to complete and the deadline dates.
3. **APPLY FOR SCHOLARSHIPS AND GRANTS** - Besides aid offered directly by an institution and aid for which your need analysis form is an automatic application

Basically there are four types of financial assistance:

- SCHOLARSHIPS** Nonrepayable awards based on merit or merit plus need.
- GRANTS** Nonrepayable based on need.
- LOANS** Funds loaned through a lending institution with interest rates that are usually reasonable (loans may be guaranteed by the federal government in which case the government pays the interest on the loan while the student is in school).
- WORK STUDY PROGRAMS** Jobs that allow the student to earn money toward an education while still enrolled in school. (Students can sometimes get jobs related to their program of study).

Visiting a Post-Secondary School

The visit needs to be carefully planned. Following is a list of suggestions to help prepare for the visit.

1. Make an appointment! Contact the Admissions Office to set up a date, time and the departments that you may be interested in visiting.
2. Be prompt.
3. Plan on spending at least half a day on the campus. In addition to the tour of the campus try to:
 - A. Sit in on a class - check out shops, labs and classrooms.
 - B. Have a meal on campus.
 - C. Browse in the library.
 - D. Talk with other students on campus.
 - E. Spend some time in the student center or union.
 - F. Visit with Financial Aid officer.
 - G. Visit with professors and/or coaches.
4. Some questions to ask:
 - A. What is the student-to-teacher ratio? How large will the typical class be?
 - B. What is the percentage of graduates in this course of study who find work? What is their average starting salary?
 - C. How do students receive extra help with difficult assignments?
 - D. What are the full costs of attending school, including tuition and fees, room and board and books?
 - E. What about health services, the library, employment counseling, personal counseling and academic advising?
 - F. What sports, clubs and other extra-curricular activities are there to help "round out" the education experience?
 - G. What options are available in case goals change?
5. Keep notes on your visit(s). Do not rely on your memory. Take into account your feelings while you were on campus (comfortable, lost, afraid, overwhelmed).
