

Approved by the South Dakota Board of Education Standards in July 2018

## HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENT

- Base Diploma Requirements (required of ALL students)
- 22 credits



Students are required to meet the above High School Diploma requirements, also known as the 'base diploma'. Student's nay earn advanced endorsements with their high school diploma. A student's personal learning plan must document a minimum of 22 credits that include the above requirements.

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


#### Requirements

South Dakota's current requirements for graduation were passed by the Board of Education Standards on July 16, 2018. Those requirements are outlined in <u>South Dakota Administrative Rule 24:43:11</u>. The requirements include a base of required coursework and the ability for students to earn endorsements on top of that base. The requirements are designed to provide flexibility for students to meet their postsecondary and career aspirations within a framework of general requirements.



#### South Dakota High School Graduation Requirements

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Students are required to meet the above High School Diploma requirements, also known as the 'base diploma'. 

#### South Dakota High School Graduation Requirements

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\*A state-approved advanced computer science course may be substituted for one unit of a science elective, but may not replace Biology. A list of approved courses is available at http://dos.sd.gov/gradrequirements.

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South Dakota has one regular signed diploma.

However, IEP teams may modify the course requirements needed to receive a district diploma.

# This should be done with caution and by fully informing the parents and student of any implications that may be a result from modifying the course requirements.

**Definition of a Regular High School Diploma:** Students who exit an educational program through receipt of a regular high school diploma identical to that for which students without disabilities are eligible.

- These students met the same standards for graduation as students without disabilities.
- Does not include an alternative degree not fully aligned with the state's academic standards, such as a certificate/district diploma or GED.
- The IEP team must denote whether the student will meet the same graduation course requirements as students without disabilities or if the IEP team is modifying the course requirements.
- If modifying the graduation requirements, IEP teams must document on the comments in the course of study section on the IEP courses that will be modify and document on the prior written notice the decision and reason.
- The IEP team should bring forward the modified graduation course(s) each year.
- If the student's course requirements are modified, then Free Appropriate Public Education (FAPE) does not end until they meet all regular diploma requirements similar to their peers or age out.



# ACCOMMODATIONS VS MODIFICATIONS

#### **Accommodations and Modifications**

#### Accommodations

An accommodation is a support or service that is provided to help a student fully access the general education curriculum. Accommodations provided during classroom instruction and assessments must also be provided during state assessments, if permitted.

- Change *how* a child learns or accesses the curriculum
- Change the way materials are presented
- Change the way a student can respond
- Allow students with disabilities the opportunity to complete the same curricular activities as peers
- Keep intact the objectives of the content or activity
- Enable the student to bypass the effects of the disability
- Help remove barriers

#### **Modifications**

Modifications are changes to course content, required work, or instructional level. They change the learning goal for an individual student and are used when the general curriculum is too advanced for a student. Modifications usually involve changing an assignment or objective.

- Change *what* a child is taught or expected to do in school
- Individualizes changes made to the content and performance expectations for students
- Change the **complexity** level of information
- Modify the course or activities/objectives to meet the needs of the learner
- Allow a student with a more significant learning need to experience the same curriculum as his or her peers, but with different learning outcomes
- Utilizes different grading criteria and/or credits received compared to peers







Some accommodations could also be modifications Need to look at what is being taught (content standards) and what the expectations are (at grade level)



REDUCING THE NUMBER OF ITEMS ON AN ASSIGNMENT

- if the student can show he/she understands all of the content needed for the assignment with less items it is an accommodation
- if the student is only doing the easier items and those do not cover all the content then it's a modification






