If an agency is going to be paying for or providing services during the IEP timeframe, that agency should be invited to

the IEP meeting. Prior to inviting the agency, written parental consent must be received from parent (or student, if he/she has reached age of majority). **Division of Rehabilitation Services (DRS).** Assists eligible individuals with physical or mental disabilities to obtain and maintain employment. Services may include guidance & counseling, Pre-Employment Transition Services (Pre-ETS), training, job placement and more. Offers services to individuals who have blindness or a visual impairment.
