## Overview of Services

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# Mission:

To ensure that people with intellectual and developmental disabilities have equal opportunities and receive the services and supports they need to live and work in South Dakota communities.

# State Funded Family Supports

# Respite Care Program

100% General Funds

Respite Care is designed to help family care givers receive breaks so that they can be more effective providers over a long term basis. The goal is to reduce stress and help maintain family relationships, strengthening the family as a unit.

# Respite Care

- Each family will receive \$600 for one individual, \$800 for two individuals and \$1,000 for three or more individuals. This is annually
- Short turn around time from when application is received.
- Families are required to find their own providers and fill out the required paperwork.

# Strengthening Families Program

- Provide services to individuals have a disability as described in SDCL 27B-1-18 but do not qualify or need FS360 waiver services
- No service coordination is offered
- Participant makes a Division approved purchase, provides Division with receipt(s) and is reimbursed
- Short application turn around

# Strengthening Families Services

100% General Funds

- May include:
  - Incontinence Supplies
  - Prescribed Medications/Nutritional Supplements
  - Recreational Opportunities
  - Adaptive Equipment
  - Housing Modifications
  - Travel Expenses for Medical Care
  - Vehicle Modifications/Repairs

# Home and Community Based Services (HCBS)

- DDD operates two waivers which provide services to South Dakotans with intellectual or developmental disabilities (I/DD)
  - HCBS services are provided in lieu of Intermediate Care Facility for Individuals with Intellectual Disabilities (ICF/IID) services
- The term “Waiver” designates CMS approval for the state to deliver HCBS to a subset of the state’s Medicaid population

# ID/DD Eligibility

- Disability eligibility requirements outlined in Administrative Rules of South Dakota (ARSD) 67:54:04:05
  - An individual is considered developmentally disabled if the individual meets all of the following criteria:
    - 1) The individual has a severe, chronic disability attributable to intellectual disability, cerebral palsy, epilepsy, head injury, brain disease, or autism or any other condition, other than mental illness, closely related to intellectual disability and requires treatment or services similar to those required for individuals with intellectual disabilities. To be closely related to intellectual disability, a condition must cause impairment of general intellectual functioning or adaptive behavior similar to that of intellectual disability;
    - 2) The disability manifested itself before the individual reached age 22; and
    - 3) The disability is likely to continue indefinitely.
- Utilize the diagnostic requirements outlined in the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Medical Disorders (DSM)- 5
- Must be receiving SSI or be aged, blind, or disabled and have income less than 300 percent of the SSI standard benefit amount

# Family Support 360

- Family Support 360 is self-directed which means the person and their family control how their services are provided and how their allotted budget is spent with the help from their FS coordinator
  - Each individual receiving FS 360 services chooses a Family Support Coordinator who will support the person and their family to identify and access services to meet their needs.

# Family Support 360 Waiver Services

Waiver Service	Overview
Support Coordination	Facilitation and development of a comprehensive person-centered individualized support plan
Respite Care	Short-term, intermittent breaks for primary caregivers
Companion Care	Include supervised integrated socialization, role modeling, and independent living skill development.
Personal Care	Provides a range of assistance to enable waiver participants to accomplish tasks including assistance with eating, bathing, personal hygiene, and activities of daily living.
Supported Employment	Supports to sustain paid employment at or above minimum wage in an integrated setting in the general workforce

# Family Support 360 Waiver Services

Waiver Service	Overview
Vehicle Modification	Adaptations or alterations to an automobile or van that is the waiver participant's primary means of transportation in order to accommodate the special needs of the participant.
Specialized Medical Adaptive Equipment and Supplies	Devices, controls or appliances specified in the plan of care which enable participants to increase or maintain their ability to perform activities of daily living, or to perceive, control, or communicate with the environment in which they live
Nutritional Supplements	Products that are used to complement a participant's dietary needs
Environmental Accessibility	Include those physical adaptations to the home, which are necessary to ensure the health, welfare, and safety of the participant, or which enable the participant to function with greater independence in the home

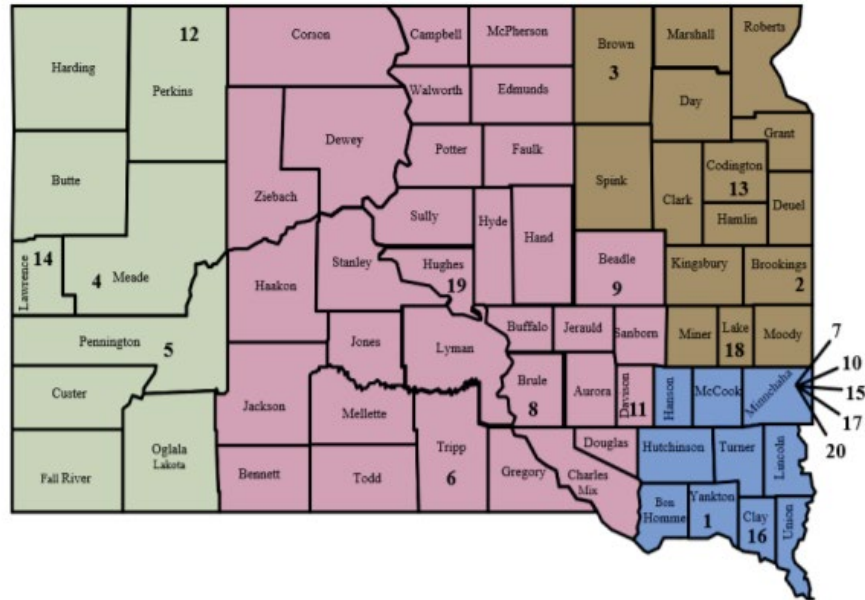
- Community, Hope, Opportunity, Independence, Careers, Empowerment, Success (CHOICES)

# CHOICES Waiver Services

Waiver Service	Overview
Case Management	Facilitation and development of a comprehensive person-centered individualized support plan
Residential Supports	Options range from 24/7 supervision and support to intermittent support throughout the day or week in a person's private apartment or house. This includes Shared Living
Day Services	Intended to assist the person to gain opportunities for meaningful life experiences in coordination with the person's personal goals and supports and agreed upon by the ISP team
Supported Employment Individual & Group	Supports to sustain paid employment at or above minimum wage in an integrated setting in the general workforce
Career Exploration	Designed to assist participants in identifying and developing skills that prepare them for integrated competitive


# CHOICES Waiver Services

Waiver Service	Overview
Nursing	Screenings and assessments, nursing diagnosis, treatment, staff training for individuals who provide services to participants, scheduling medical appointments, monitoring of medical care and related services, providing health education/prevention, policy and procedure development and review and response to medical illnesses and emergencies.
Specialized Medical Equipment and Drugs	Devices, controls or appliances specified in the plan of care which enable participants to increase or maintain their ability to perform activities of daily living, or to perceive, control, or communicate with the environment in which they live
Other medically related services- speech, hearing, and language	Implementation of direct therapies, treatment and services which are limited to those not available under the State Plan.
