#### Evaluations & Incentives

Incentive Program: we set up a program that would be similar to a real-life work experience. The students can earn "credit" or "money" for things like being on time, working/ completing assigned tasks, following directions, helping one another, etc. At the end of the camp, our students are allowed to "cash in" their incentives. The students can use the money they earned to budget for their incentive items. We go to a local store, and they must adhere to their budget to purchase items within their small budget. Generally, incentives consist of school supplies or food items.

Daily Activity Rating Sheet – Students will be assessed through written samples, behavior/compliance, performance, and observation. This Rating sheet will include the activities for the day, which will also help the students with executive functioning and time management.
