








 Career and technical education (CTE) is the practice of teaching skills-based careers to students in middle school, high school, and beyond.

CAREER CLUSTERS AND PATHWAYS

- South Dakota recognizes and supports 16 career clusters and their respective pathways. Career clusters are designed to help students acquire the knowledge and skills they need to reach their postsecondary and/or career goals.
- All career clusters have Foundational CTE Courses in common. Foundational CTE courses aim to give students foundational knowledge and skills that apply to any career field they may explore or pursue in the future. In a scope and sequence of CTE courses, Foundational CTE courses are the first courses that then progress into career cluster or pathway-specific courses.



16 CAREER CLUSTERS

While there are thousands of occupations in our national workforce, the National **Career Clusters Framework** groups occupations into sixteen different clusters based on similarities in foundational knowledge and skills needed to achieve career success.


CAREER CLUSTER PATHWAYS

Foundational CTE courses apply across all 16 career clusters and aim to give students foundational knowledge and skills that apply to any career field they may explore or pursue in the future.

Cluster specific courses address the knowledge, skills and dispositions that are important to becoming career ready in any cluster.

Pathway courses are grouped together in related sequence so students can build on cluster specific skills they've already mastered.

Dual Credit courses allow students the opportunity to gain college credit along with their high school course credits, while in high school, and at a reduced rate.

Academic courses are traditional course options that enhance the programming and instruction students are learning about in their CTE specific courses.

Capstone experiences allow students the opportunity to apply the learning from their high school coursework into a meaningful and relevant career-related experience. This student-driven experience is based on the student's chosen career cluster or pathway and designed to help increase college or career readiness.


HOW IS CTE CURRENTLY IMPACTING YOUR STUDENTS?

Special Populations (on an IEP) involved in CTE in South Dakota

- Of CTE participants statewide about 11% were on an IEP.
- Of CTE concentrators statewide about 10% were on an IEP.

A participant is any student taking any one CTE course.

A **concentrator** is any student taking two or more CTE courses in any pathway.




CTE IN SOUTH DAKOTA

The South Dakota economy is experiencing a skills gap...



54% of jobs in South Dakota require skills training - more education than high school but less than a four-year degree.




47% of South Dakota workers are trained at this level.

Career and technical education (CTE) programs can fill these gaps, particularly in South Dakota's key industries, such as:

- manufacturing
- livestock development
- precision agriculture
- cybersecurity





CTE IN SOUTH DAKOTA

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in South Dakota, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based experiences with industry partners.



During the 2021-22 school year, South Dakota had 25,282 secondary CTE participants.



In 2022, almost 2, 100 South Dakota high school CTE concentrators graduated having participated in an internship, apprenticeship or other CTE Capstone experience.
