# Thinking Ahead... Life After High School

As a young adult getting ready to venture into the adult world, have you been thinking about all your options after high school? Yes, you just started a new school year, but learning about your options helps you figure out which one will best suit your needs and dreams while empowering you to make an informed decision. All your options take time to set up so now is the time to start planning ahead so you have a plan in place.

Whatever path you choose, there could be supports & services that will help you access and maintain success. I can help you explore all your options so you can make a decision about which path will be in your best interest!

#### **18-21 Transition Programs**

South Dakota has a variety of 18-21 transition programs, including Project SEARCH, that allow students to continue receiving high school services after completing required educational requirements. These programs will focus on increasing your independent living and employment skills for future success.

#### **Public or Private University**

Pursuing a degree at a university can be a challenging and rewarding way to focus more on specific subjects you may have studied in high school that really interest you. Typically, a bachelor's degree takes around four years to complete and can be more expensive because there are living expenses for on-campus housing and food in addition to tuition expenses.

#### **Vocational College**

Vocational colleges trains students for a specific line of work in hands-on fields. Vocational colleges are different from typical four-year universities because the programs are less academic-based and more job-focused, and typically take around 2 years to finish.

#### **Apprenticeships**

This option allows you to earn a salary working with on-the-job training as you receive some classroom instruction to prepare you for a specific job. Apprenticeships are available in a large range of professions and available through the SD Dept of Labor.

#### **Employment in your Community**

Talk to me, your Vocational Rehabilitation Counselor, about finding a job in your community. It is a chance for you to start an independent life while still having familiar supports that can help you.
